Strawberry Rhubarb Custard Pie

- 1 (9 inch) unbaked pie crust
- 3 cups rhubarb, sliced 1/4-inch thick
- 1 cup fresh strawberries, quartered
- 3 large eggs
- 1 ½ cups white sugar
- 3 tablespoons milk
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- ¼ teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg
- 1 tablespoon butter, diced
- 2 tablespoons strawberry jam
- ¼ teaspoon water

We finally got the much-needed rain and this summer's weather has been beautiful. The excitement in the Milwaukee area for the Bucks and Brewers has been amazing!

The Bucks are on the verge of trying to win their first NBA championship since 1971. 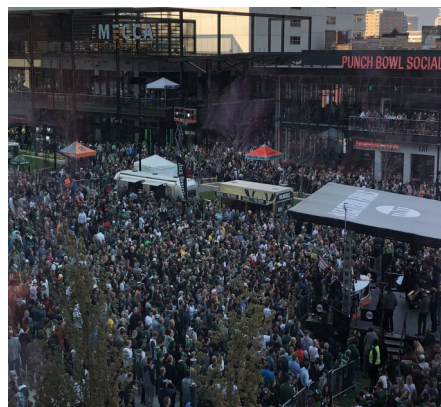
Enjoy the weather and have a Safe 4th of July.

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Place rolled-out pie crust in a 9-inch pie plate and set on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper or a silicone baking mat.
2. Combine rhubarb and strawberries in a bowl; transfer to the pie crust.
3. Whisk eggs, sugar, milk, flour, and nutmeg together in a medium bowl. Slowly pour filling over rhubarb mixture until it just reaches the top edge of the crust. Scatter diced butter evenly over the top of the filling.
4. Bake, turning halfway through, until rhubarb is tender and custard is set, about 1 hour.
5. Mix strawberry jam and water in a small bowl; heat in the microwave until warm, about 15 seconds. Glaze the top of the pie with the jam mixture and let cool.
