- From 2011 to 2032, CBS /Turner will pay \$19.6 billion for the TV/streaming rights.
- The worst ranked seed to win the tournament is an 8. (Villanova in 1985)

## Jamaican Style Curry Chicken

- ¼ cup vegetable oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 tomato, chopped
- 1 garlic clove, chopped
- 2 tablespoons Jamaican-style curry powder
- 2 slices habanero pepper (Optional)
- ¼ teaspoon ground thyme
- 2 skinless, boneless chicken breast halves, cut into 1 1/2-inch pieces
- 1 cup water
- ½ teaspoon salt, or to taste

## Directions

1. Heat vegetable oil in a skillet over medium-high heat; cook and stir onion, tomato, garlic, curry powder, habanero pepper, and thyme until onion is golden, about 7 minutes. Stir in chicken and cook until chicken is lightly browned, about 5 minutes.
2. Pour water into the skillet, reduce heat to low; cover and simmer until chicken is no longer pink at the center, about 30 minutes. Season with salt.
